This event is for members who have completed 20 years membership. Open to 5, 6 & 7 day members.

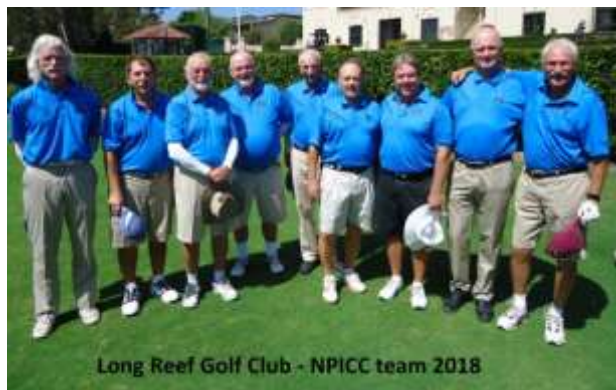
Masters Pennant 2018

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Volunteers and families No.4

The Greenwoods.

When Cecil F. Martin wrote to Warringah Council in 1920 suggesting that a Golf Links be created at Long Reef, Mr A. C. Greenwood was one of 9 councillors to receive it. Following the approval by both the Lands Department and the Council he attended the Meeting of Interest on May 14th 1921. As a Collaroy Street resident all he had to do was hop and skip over the tram line to the Twilight Tea House to attend. A.C. Greenwood joined Long Reef Golf Club that night becoming a general committee member.

The real volunteer of the family was his daughter Elsie. Elsie joined the Club in 1926. The Women's records pre 1950 have not survived, but the Club Minute Books, the Membership ledgers and newspaper reports have, and this is where we learn about Elsie's contribution to the Club.

A newspaper cutting titled "Personalities in Golf," on 17 June 1933 confirms that Elsie was a committee member and good player.

"Handicap Manager of Long Reef Club, Miss Elsie Greenwood, who recently underwent an operation for appendicitis, has returned home fully recovered to health after recuperating in the Crookwell district. Associates will remember her fine play last year, when she was runner-up in the Club Championships." Grade Team lists which have been collected at Manly Golf Club list Elsie as a Grade player throughout the 30's and results in newsprint show her Medal wins. The Club Committee Minutes acknowledge work done as a Social Committee member helping to arrange things like the Annual Club dinner in a Hall in Manly.

As was reported in the Herald in October 1929 "The Annual Dinner of the Long Reef Golf Club was held last night at the Soldiers' Memorial Hall Manly. About two hundred members and their friends were present. Light and dark blue, the colours of the club were used to decorate the hall. One of the attractions of the dance was a putting competition; Balloons, Jazz caps and novelties were distributed among the guests." (Sounds fun! but what is a jazz cap?)

Everything changed at the club during the second World War after 1940 but this is when Elsie seems to have risen to the needs of the times. She must have become a full-time volunteer. Only 55 women were still members of the club in 1945. Elsie was one of them and by remaining a member she helped keep the Club alive. If games could be held at all, between artillery firing practice days, a percentage of every fee paid was donated to the war fund. Elsie became honorary secretary of the club's war fund committee. To start with support was given to the Lord Mayor's Fund by arranging four Open days in a season and sending off 40 pounds and 50 pairs of hand knitted socks! There were blackout curtains to make and hang. She reported to the Club Committee the various functions in connection with the "Associates Patriotic and War fund." There were so many requests for help and many had to be rejected. The Club did its best for the Council's War Fund, The Red Cross, The War Vets, Air force House, Bundles for Britain, Furlough House, City Night refuge and soup kitchen, Manly N.E.S Ambulance Drivers Fund and the local Red Cross Mobile Canteen.

A letter of thanks was sent to her in August 1941 for the fine work being done by "Miss Greenwood in sending away so many canteen orders to our Members who have enlisted." Comfort (the name of

the charity) Dances, knitting groups and so many raffles were held to raise funds. The food parcels continued to be sent after 1945, as part of the Food

for Britain project. The Club sent parcels directly to the West Kent Golf Club.

Miss Elsie Greenwood had a hand in it all. She deserves some sort of medal! She resigned her membership in 1946 after 20 years of 'service' and moved to Victoria with her family. She didn't get to see the course repaired and redesigned or indeed be there to be thanked by those members who returned and had received the canteen orders while serving in the military. Her volunteer efforts went well beyond the golf course boundary.

RULES WITH GEORGE



ANSWER: b. is correct. Rule 25-3 Wrong Putting Green.

Interference to a player's stance or the area of intended swing is not, of itself, interference under **Rule 25-3a**. Bernard must play the ball as it lies and if, as a result, damage to the green occurs he should repair it. Naturally, he may declare the ball unplayable and take relief incurring a penalty of one stroke.
