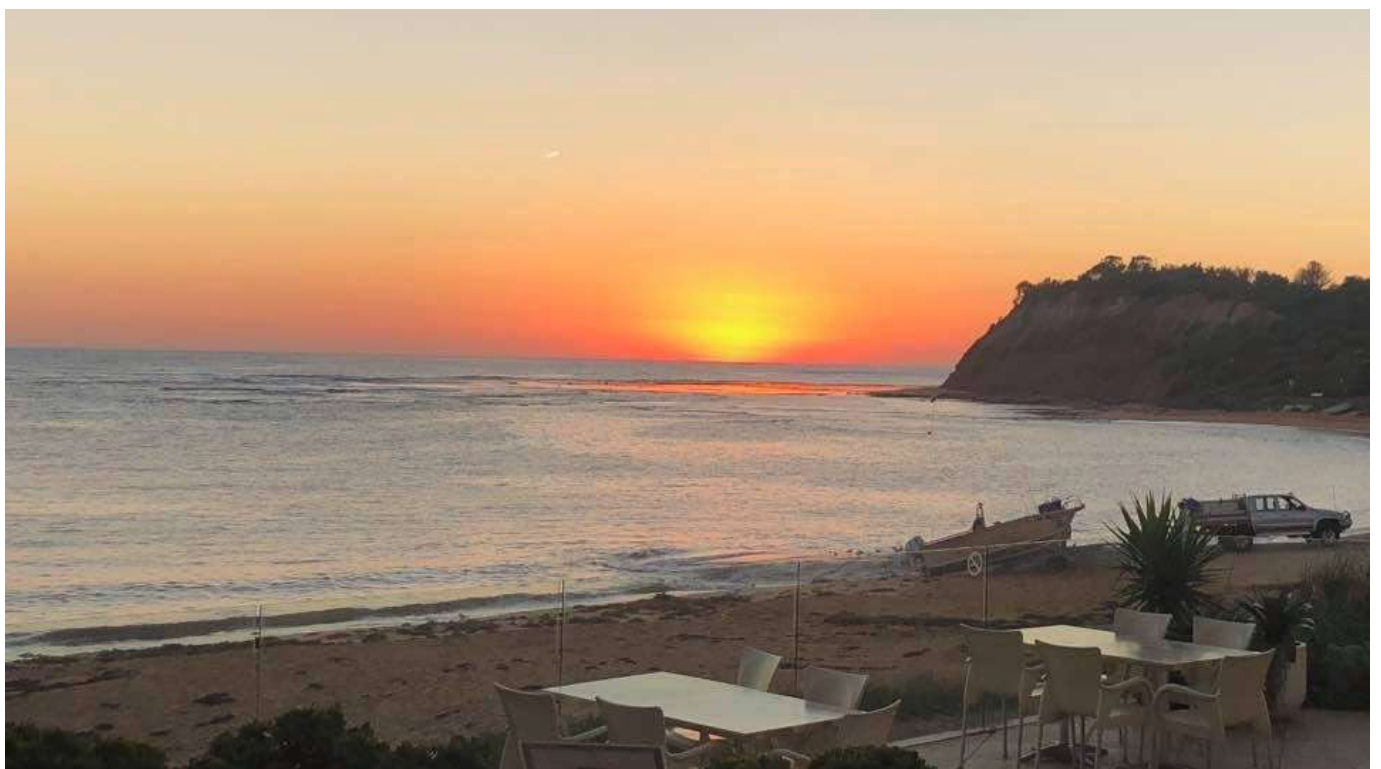

## FROM THE ARCHIVES

### Volunteers and families No.7

It is always exciting for the Archive Committee to fill in any of the gaps of the history of Women at the Club pre 1950. This newspaper cutting illustrates something of the present theme of families that volunteer. We can ask the question - what is a family member, parents, siblings, spouses, children, cousins, in-laws or out laws!? Here we learn of a mother and daughter, the Macleans, and they were on the Associates committee at the same time, and it is the daughter in the executive position.

#### The Macleans

In the Sydney Morning Herald in October 1932 the Office Bearers of Long Reef Golf Club Associates' Committee is listed, following the AGM.

President - Mrs MacInnes

Captain - Miss Maclean

Hon. Secretary - Miss Foggitt

Hon Treasurer - Miss Vernon

Handicap Manager -Miss Greenwood

Committee - Mrs Whitehead and Mrs Rawnsley

Publicity Officer - Miss Peddey

(We can see a family connection in the glossary of the book 'Long Reef Golf Club -The First 65 years', by member Ross lanes - that Mr A. Macinnes was a vice-President from 1930-34, Mr Foggitt was made a Life Member in 1928 and Mr Rawnsley was Club Captain from 1928-32. All in the family!)

The Archives also have a very grainy photo of Miss Maclean, again from a newspaper article in 1932.

Our recently retired golfer and Gold member, Josie Murray, had many a year on the Associates Committee, Barrenjoey Peninsula Week of Golf Committee and as the Veterans' Delegate and

remains in the club as a Bridge player. What you might not know is that her mother-in-law was President, Mrs.P. Murray (Muriel) from 1956-57. Muriel Murray was the first elected President to be limited to a maximum of three years in an Executive position. She followed President Annis Soutar who had been in the position for 16 years.

In the 70's the old buggy room became the Associates' Office and Josie's husband, David, who had joined the club before Josie did, was there to help fit it out with cupboards and shelves, while the Associates did the painting.

It was Ruby Watts, who had been a member since 1940, who gave Annis a little push along and out of the President's position by proposing the change. Ruby was such a good golfer, has her name on the honour boards more than any other woman, was Grade Captain in the celebrated 1968 win, and a respected administrator. What's more she had a sister, Bunny Akehurst! They were both to become Life Members. (Their profiles and photos can be seen in the women's locker room.) Bunny served for two years on the Committee with Ruby when Ruby

was President from 1960-62 and then went on straight afterwards to be Captain herself from 1962-64.
