RULES WITH GEORGE

RULES WITH GEORGE



ANSWER: (c) is correct. Rule 14.3b (3) applies. Whenever a ball is dropped in a relief area the ball must remain in and be played from the relief area for the ball to be correctly in play. This was not the case for Charles and because he has played from a wrong place, the penalty is The General Penalty....2 strokes in Stableford, or Par events as well as Stroke events. Charles should have lifted and re-dropped the ball, before he played a stroke at it, to avoid the penalty. Rule 14.5 applies

Wetlands Project - 30th May Update



The first load

The excavation started on Monday and with the fine weather is moving well.

There will be over 1,000 trips by the 30 ton trucks over the next few weeks.

The mounding will be roughly shaped with the final shaping overseen by Warren Duncan (Thomson Perrett) before turfing.

NOTE travel from 15th green to 16th tee

Most of the 16th fairway will be under construction so the path FOR ALL PLAYERS AND CARTS to the 16th green will be the concrete path on the current 16th tee then a line to the roped off area adjacent to the OOB. Note the 'bunting fence' must be kept to your left.

Please make yourself aware of the updated Local Rules. Particularly the one re not entering the 'fenced off' area for any reason. Note for a long term Member... there is NO penalty for taking relief from this area!!!
