LRGC MEMBERS SURVEY – SUMMARY

We are grateful to the many Members who completed this year's biennial "Members Survey". We had a 30% response rate (292 playing members completed the survey) many of whom provided valuable written feedback and suggestions on all aspects impacting the course, the club and other areas of the club's operation.

Highlights included:

- On every category (except the locker facilities/ bathrooms) the results surpassed both the 2015 and 2017 weighted averages.
- Generally the golf course rated very well overall although the bunkers scored below standard.
- Level of communication to the members has improved overall.
- Many of the comments advocated for the upgrade of the Clubhouse.
- We received many positive comments regarding the club staff and grounds staff.
- Whilst the scores showed a significant improvement in bar and catering many of the comments indicated that there is room for improvement in food and service standards.

The purpose of the survey is to create an opportunity for Members to provide feedback to the Board and club administration on the key issues and areas where improvements can be made. Whilst we were pleased that this years results have shown major improvements against the 2017 benchmark, we recognise that there are many more opportunities for the club to achieve excellence.

NSW JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS:

We had 5 juniors represent LR in last weeks NSW Junior Championships at Belmont and Charlestown Golf Clubs.

Both courses were a little wet from the rain the week prior. There was a cut after day 2 with the top 60 players plus ties advancing, as well as the top 40% in each age group that weren't already exempt. Kai and Chun-Ta both made the cut in the U13 Boys - with Kai holding a 3 shot lead after the first 36 holes over a local junior, and both played the final two rounds at Belmont GC.

Jack, Mitch and Cian missed the cut and played the final 2 rounds at Charlestown GC.

The weather for the final two days wasn't kind to the players with 55km/h winds causing havoc at both courses, especially Belmont as it is right on the ocean. After a struggle on Day 3, Kai was able to hold a one shot lead in the 13Boys heading into the final round, however a great final round by the eventual winner (a 1 over round in the wind!) meant Kai ended up finishing 2nd in the 13Boys and T32 overall with rounds of 76,74,80,78- a great effort. Chun-Ta ended up finishing 4th in the 13Boys, saving his best score to last.

At Charlestown GC the consistent Mitch Jones won the U15 Boys Nett by 17shots, playing the week in +2 to his handicap!! Cian Hughes also came 2nd in the U16 Boys - saving his best round to last as well. Jack Davies started the event with the best round he has had in a while, however faded as the went went on.

A great week for all the boys - and plenty of things to learn for the next event/s. They all represented Long Reef proudly, well done boys!


The '70s continued

The course - two halves reversed and renumbered 1979.

The late 70s not only saw and celebrated one moment of change in time but three major related movements involving both the clubhouse and the course! The Pro shop moved into a self-standing building which was based around the bowlers' old change shed. The Starter's Box was demolished (players had a certain affection for it and were sad to see it go) and, of major significance, the course was renumbered. Basically the two halves were reversed, with the new Pro shop beside the new 1st tee.

Having teed off on the old 1st, across from the front of the clubhouse and the then putting green from the adjacent Starter's Box for over sixty years it must have felt so different for the players to finish their rounds cruising down the new 16th (hopefully without putting a ball on the beach below) and 17th, and then turn for home and the clubhouse on the 18th.

The freed-up space in the clubhouse allowed for the men's locker room to be extended and renovated and a Juniors' Room created. This was all part of a 5-year plan which also proposed the Snooker Room for the revised space in the clubhouse. (There had been a billiard table in the dining room before this.) The two tables in the Snooker room opened in 1979 and a club started a year later. It added a new dimension to drinks on a Friday night! (Sadly, the club does not have a photo of the Snooker room - now The Office)

In the second part of the decade Ray Cordaiy was the Club President from 1975-77, followed by Graham Clark who remained until 1984. From 1975 until 1982 the Club Captain role was filled by

John Hall, Vic Roberts and Richie Burke. Meanwhile the 'Associates' were still celebrating the creation of an Office out of the old buggy room in

1975! The committee no longer had to do business and run a full programme from a table in the corner of the Associates lounge! Mel Parnell was the President from 1975, followed by Audrey Roger in 1978. The Captains were Bebe McLean and Val Freeman.

RULES WITH GEORGE



ANSWER: (d) is correct. Rule 11.1 applies. If a player's ball accidentally hits any person or outside influence, **there is no penalty to any player** even if the ball hits the player, the opponent, or any other player, or any of their caddies or equipment. There is no provision for the stroke to be replayed.
