Repairing the 11th

We have started the repair in the affected greens, 10, 11 & 16 have been turfed with sods and we will also do the same on 6 next Monday. The others will be patched/plugged (as on 17). Hopefully with good weather and some rain they will be in reasonable condition by the end of September.

The vandalism is covered by our insurance, both for remedial work and loss of public green fee income.

Please try not to walk on the new turf, unless putting. If your ball is on one of the 'seams' you can take relief (up to 20cm), however there is no relief if you are on or need to putt through the new turf.... See Local Rule. Again, a big thank you to Monash who kindly offered their nursery grass.

Note; the greens are in play, and looking at the scores are putting OK.

RULES WITH GEORGE



QUESTION: In a Stroke event, Phillip played his second shot on the third hole into the greenside bunker. When he got to his ball he found that surprisingly it was in a very small pool of temporary water. Jim playing in the same group said "Lucky there is plenty of room to drop your ball in the dry sand in the bunker".

Phillip decided to take Back- On-the-Line Relief so went back outside the bunker on a line straight back from the hole through the original spot of the ball. He marked a reference point on that line about 5 metres from the bunker.

He dropped a new ball within one club-length of the Reference Point, no nearer the hole and played it onto the green. He holed out in two more strokes. What is his score for the hole?

Wetlands Project – 22nd August Update



14th Fairway



15th fully turfed

The turf on the top section has just about all been laid, now we need the rain.

The work that has or will be done over the next month;

- 9th mound and LHS 8th turfed.
- Practice tee widened and lengthened
- The 'haul roads' used by the trucks refurbished.
- Practice chipping green and bunker.
- Practice fairway, trimmed and grassed
- Landscaping the edges of the Pond
- The safety fence will start coming down early September.

The 8th hole will stay a Par 3 until the landscaping is in place for safety reasons.

The 10th, 14th and 15th will stay as temporaries until the new grass has established, hopefully play (with GUR) in October.

As the fairway has been grassed on the 16th it may not be fully playable until November.

Playing the course over the next few weeks; 14th – With the vandalism we will continue to play the temporary green. 16th – Will continue to play to 14th green, giving the 16th green extra time to recover.

18th – On weekends we play the normal tees. Midweek we will play the shorter tee until the practice fairway is completed. The Stroke Rating will stay the same no matter which tee we use

Note players **can't** enter the fenced off area.

NOTE – ALL new work, including tractor marks are GUR.

ANSWER: (b) is correct. Phillip played 5 strokes at his ball but must add **one** penalty stroke because he chose to drop his ball outside the bunker instead of dropping in the bunker when taking relief from the temporary water. **Rule 16.1c: applies.**

There is no additional penalty for dropping a ball different from his original. The 2 stroke penalty under **Rule 19.3b** does not apply in this situation.
