#### FROM THE ARCHIVES

We are always very grateful for items of memorabilia to add to the collection. This week I extend our thanks to Lynne Parsons for a 'Representative' shirt to add to the pale blue collection. Les Browne also donated a very attractive name badge that his mother had worn. The name "Addie Browne" is clearly read on a silver bar with crossed clubs on a circle of two shades of blue.

A few weeks ago the Office received an unused score card in mint condition with a letter attached. It was sent from John Small who now lives at Pelican Waters. He started playing golf at Coffs Harbour in 1966, and while there as a ten-year-old he started to collect score cards. Most came from the courses his parents had played and some he 'scrounged' himself. Discovering his large collection again recently, as his downsized for a house move, he decided to send all the cards back to the respective original clubs. He says the collection is around 40-50 years old and he thinks the Long Reef card was in use between 1966-70.

As always it has been fun to try to prove or disprove that date. The first thing that strikes is how simple the card is and lacking information compared to the present. We can see that the NWSGA Rating was 70.35 and the NSWLGU 73. The men's details run down one side the Associates the other. The measurements are in yards, still possible in the early 70s. There have been several course numbering changes since this card was printed as well as the use of the once practice area by the oval, along with extra land up the hill making up the new 1st and 2nd hole and 3rd tee after 1966.

I am persuaded to think that at the very oldest this card was handed out in 1964. The Bowling Green is mentioned in the local rules out of bounds section

on the card. The green was dismantled in 1970. It states that the following were out of bounds-"the drain between the two white pegs on the western side of the 9th fairway, the Bowling Green and over the cliff at the 16th hole."

But it is the 3 Par 3's on one side of the course, (in the first 7 holes) with just one on the return nine that gives us a big clue. Was the Long Reef signature hole the "biggest bunker in Sydney" played as the 7th hole in 1963 (if only for a few years - proof found on the Hole-in-one silver covered bottle) until 1964 when it was numbered as the 16th. It was abandoned to the dunes in 1966 when another par 3 took its place. The course was played from starting on the then 1st which is now the 9th. The first nine holes were played as a par 5,3,4,5,3,4,3, before finishing with the par 4 8th and par 5 9th? Clear as mud!?

The hole-in-one records show this achievement in 1963 at the then 7th hole, (the 16th is a par 4) but either way the pre-1964 7th was very different from the present 7th in both difficulty and position.

#### Wetlands Project – 12th September Update



Shaping the practice bunker

With the good weather we are nearing completion... This week we

- Planted 1000 tubers around the pond, these are part of the landscaping and will stabilise the banks
- Excavated and secured the water ingress to the new pond from in front of 8<sup>th</sup> green where the water from Anzac Av will enter the pond.
- Turfed from the 8<sup>th</sup> tee down the left hand side of the fairway.
- Prepared the practice chipper for irrigation and 'seeding'.
- Installed the practice bunker.
- Prepared the practice fairway for turfing, ensuring run off to prevent pooling of water.
- For the first time mowed the new mounds on 16<sup>th</sup> which means the turf has taken well.

The work that is left to do over the next week or so;

- Practice tee widened and lengthened.
- 'Seeding' the chipping green with cores from practice green and 16<sup>th</sup>.
- Practice fairway grassed.
- Further landscaping around the pond including Banksia trees on the 4<sup>th</sup>.
- For safety reasons, and to protect the new growth, the fence will be in place until mid-November, also it has to be moved outward to protect the construction and landscaping around the edge of the pond particularly on the 18<sup>th</sup> where it will further encroach on the fairway.

Players can't enter the fenced off area.

NOTE – ALL new work, including new turf, tractor marks etc are **compulsory** GUR.

#### **RULES WITH GEORGE**



ANSWER: (c) is correct. Rule 9.6/3 (Interpretations: Official Guide to the Rules of

Golf): If information that the ball was in fact moved by an outside influence, (Tim), only becomes known to the player after the ball has been played, the player did not play from a wrong place because this knowledge did not exist when the player made the stroke. As a result, John had not committed a breach and his score with the set aside ball must stand. Naturally it would be usual for Tim to have told John that he had set his ball aside before John played his stroke.

#### FROM THE COURSE



The week started and finished with very windy conditions with a few nice days in between allowing us to get all the new grass on the new mounds irrigated.

It has been one of our busiest weeks since work started on the wetland project and next week is shaping up to be similar. Plenty of work has happened around the new practice green with irrigation installed, the bunker complete and the green surround turfed. All up, 1,200 m/2 of turf has been laid from the 9<sup>th</sup> green back to the new dam including the edge of the 4<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> fairways. Around 35% of the new dam banks have been planted out with over 1000 plants this will help stabilise the dam edges and provide habitat for wading birds. All the new mounds have been cut for the first time this week and they have come up very nicely. Hopefully this will spur on some growth and colour especially if the weather warms up in the coming weeks. Next week we plan on starting to establish grass on the new practice green, cores will be taken off the putting green and 16<sup>th</sup> green to establish the surface. Enjoy the weekend
