

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Life Members - part 4

There have been 13 Life Members honoured since 1980, five of whom are women and their stories were featured in Part 2. Of the 8 remaining there are 5 men who served as President, 2 as Captain and one who did both! Next week the topic Life Members will finish with the very alive current Life Members.

Here we look at 3 who complete the list of 35 in a little detail. It is fair to say that all the changes and additions we presently see at the club had the planning stages commence in the 70s and 80s. Every President had a Committee or Board working alongside them as they made long term business and construction plans overlapping from one period of Presidency to another. The Wetlands project spans decades, a new Pro-shop was mooted in the 80s and the Greenkeepers shed which had been extended in 1970 was the last in the queue to receive very overdue attention.


At the start of the new decade in the 2000s the clubhouse received the first of three major additions and renovations - the start of the terrace area and the resulting provision for casual dining, house membership, and an income stream had begun. Innovative and fair membership changes were finally introduced in 1996 after years of planning presenting the open 5, 6, and 7 day categories that we have today. Credit can be widely given across all eras to all concerned for the dedication needed for all the above to be achieved.



1986 Geoff Wheatley

Geoff Wheatley's work started even earlier than the 70s. He was Captain from 1965-70 but was not nominated for Life Membership until 1986. Like many of our Life Members he served a sort of "apprenticeship" on the Club Committee before

taking on an Executive position. He was a committee member from 1963 and finished as a Vice-President in 1970. He is remembered as a very dedicated popular captain and a great supporter of all the club teams. He played in the A-Grade pennants himself, and at his peak played off 4. His name is seen on both the Foursomes and Mixed Foursomes honour boards. He was there when the club lost its challenging sand dunes par 3, and extra land was acquired making the holes that we know as the 1st and 2nd. It was also in Geoff's time that the decision was made to dismantle the old caddy shed and the Bowling green



2004 John Mullins

Having joined the Club in 1991 John soon put himself forward for volunteer positions. He was on the General Committee in 1993, and 2003. He became Vice President from 1994-97 and President from 1998-02. But his service and involvement did not stop there. In total there were 21 years of continuous service until his death in 2015. As President he chaired the new Terrace plan and acted as a Project Manager for the major building developments and course plans at the time. He tracked down grants and represented the club at Council and pursued environmental issues and obligations. He also acted as a community representative to a number of committees. A Life Member from 2004 with impeccable qualifications for that title. He was also awarded an OAM in 2013.



2011 Elwyn Heber President 2005-09.

A member for 31 years before being elected a Life Member, Elwyn served the club as a team player, committee man and President in what proved to be a testing time. The completion of the Terrace and efficient food delivery plus the continuation of the Wetlands project were important achievements during his time. There were real challenges with the lease and the financial situation, part of which can be seen in the introduced Development Levy. There were transitions to new staffing structures as seen when the Pro shop changed from Gary Churcher to Teed up's management. Sadly, Elwyn died in 2013 after a long illness.

The display cabinet in the Pro-shop has been changed. Articles displaying the Gary Churcher Long Reef Golf logo can now be seen. Gary was the Club Professional for 22 years, from 1985-2007. The logo he had designed represents the Long Reef landscape.

A new addition to the Archives item is a vest owned by former Women's President Shirley Jenkins which was donated by member Penny Ware. Thanks to them both.

FROM THE COURSE



It has been a great week of weather with most days warm but not windy, but Friday and Saturday temperatures are predicted to be in the mid to high 30's and westerly winds. This sort of weather really dries the course out and with little rain in the past few weeks it doesn't take long before everything dries out and turns yellow.

This week we managed to lightly dethatch the greens and dust them with sand which will help all the poisoned areas recover and blend back in. The recovery of these damaged areas does take time to get them back to normal as the new roots need to re-establish and the surface requires blending in. On the whole they are doing very well but each of the damaged areas suffers from drying out more than other areas and each area requires different treatment. Please be understanding that with the club championships and the damage we cannot have the cutting heights as low as we normally would and we require to have extra moisture in the greens especially in hot and windy conditions. If we are not very careful may end up losing all these areas again. For this reason, greens will not be as fast or smooth and we have to manage this situation with care each week as we have constant golf traffic and competitions.

With all the new work complete as far as the construction contractors go the job is still far from complete for the greenstaff. We still have a huge amount of work to do which will be ongoing for many months which we require to complete on top of our normal course maintenance. We have crushed drainage to repair, bare areas to grow in, sprinklers to repair and adjust, headwalls to construct, dam surrounds to establish and stabilise the list goes on but overall it has all gone extremely well. Ground Pearl damage on fairways and roughs is still causing us big problems and many areas are struggling to grow grass we are treating these areas with limited success. Hopefully we continue to get reasonable rainfall which makes our job so much easier. Have a good weekend and good golfing.

TONY COHEN WINS DOUBLE GOLD!

Popular club member Tony Cohen has tasted success at the recent National Over 75 Masters Hockey Tournament in Bunbury Western Australia, winning 2 gold medals (see pic).

RULES WITH GEORGE



ANSWER: (c) is correct. Rule 14.3b requires a player to drop a ball at knee height. Because he dropped his ball from a different height he has dropped it incorrectly and so must be penalised. Fortunately his ball had been dropped into the relief area and had remained there, so in both stroke play and match play the penalty is one stroke. If the ball dropped incorrectly had finished outside the relief area and been played, the general penalty would have applied.

Carl should have lifted his dropped ball and redropped it correctly to avoid any penalty (See Rule 14.3). There is no latitude for the height from which a player must drop a ball. Naturally knee height will be different for players of differing statures.


