- NOTE the full 16th is **NOT** in play. It is important that players don't walk or play on the new fairway.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Life Members - part 5

The 2019 Annual Report lists our existing Life Members and the two women, Lilith and Sandra, have already been described in Part 2.

Of the men the most senior is Graham Clark. Graham served on the Committee for 6 years, became Vice-President and then held the role of President for seven consecutive terms from 1977-84. As a business man, and the director of the family business, Clark Rubber, his management skills were well established. A five-year plan was adopted in 1978, leading to for example, automatic greens watering, a new Pro shop, locker room extensions and a Snooker Room. There was extensive tree planting in this era and the celebrated win of the Junior team winning the Pennant in 1982. Graham became a Life Member in 1984. Graham now resides in Casino.

Allan Delaney is the second longest serving President in the club to date, (before executive roles were limited to 5 years), having joined the club in 1966. The effective control of the Club's finances was a strength. His Presidency covered the time of extensive drainage and irrigation work, especially of the 4th and 5th fairways. The 12th was improved, leading to an ACR of 72 being attained. The clubhouse had a complete refurbishment and the Professional's role was reconstructed as Gary Churcher was welcomed, and the Gold membership category was established.

Allan encouraged and supported Ross Lanes as he wrote a history of the club.

Keith Huntingdon is a very long serving member of the Club. Having joined in 1958 he achieved Gold class membership 11 years ago. His contribution also extended to State level as delegate to NSWGA and also as an elected member of NSW Senior Golfers Society. Keith was the founder of the Northern Peninsula Golf Club Association. He was President at the time when so many special events occurred. As examples, the course looked like a moon-scape when the wetlands project was at its height in 1996. The Club celebrated its 75th birthday. Equality of membership was passed and accepted in 1995. Keith was there to see that the club had a Mission Statement for the first time, that Executive office bearers were limited to a five year maximum period at one time, and he chaired meetings engaging the Peter Thomson Master Plan of the course. The club was able to show its thanks and acknowledge the achievements and evidence of leadership skills by accepting the nomination for Life Membership in 2011.

The remaining two of our existing Life Members, Les Browne and Peter Verrills, are very well known to us and, I hope, do not need an introduction. The length and breadth of their contribution to the club is outstanding. The letters of application and nomination for their Life Membership are in the Archives for all to see, illustrating such a long and effective time of Club Service. Les was a mere child when he caddied for his father on the course and more than anyone, can describe the course changes hole by hole over 60 years later. He is a living part of our memorabilia! His contribution to golf goes way beyond the boundaries of our course. Both gentlemen show a great support of women's golf. Peter has also changed hair colour as he ticks off forty years of membership this year but his enthusiasm for the club never wavers. Peter is one of only 6 Executives of the Club to be both a Captain and a President and only one of three who have been crazy enough to do it in consecutive terms. What a lot of meetings there were to attend, important decisions to be made, and teams to support in those ten years. As a club we are fortunate that all our Life Members are on hand to advise and help as we glean from their experience.

SLOW PLAY

WHO ME?....SLOW?

SLOW PLAY IS SELFISH PLAY

You are slow if you have one clear fairway ahead; you must call the following group "through" if they are waiting and then keep up with them.

You are slow if you do not, when possible, study your putt while others are putting and thus be ready as soon as it is your turn to putt.

You are slow if you are first to hit off and you mark your card before hitting off.

You are slow if you do not move as quickly as you can between shots or if you spend an inordinate amount of time conversing with other groups. Therefore a comfortable time for the round if you play early is 3h 45m and for later players 4 hours. All players in the group are responsible for the pace of play and maintaining their position in the field.

ANSWER: (b) Although Fred was entitled to cancel Ted's stroke he must do this promptly before either player makes another stroke **Rule 6.1b** (1) applies.

In match play there is no penalty for playing outside the teeing area but the timing of the cancellation is important. If Fred had acted promptly, in cancelling before he played, it would still have been Ted's turn to play from the black tees. In this case Ted's ball played from the blue tees would still be the ball in play. Ted would be playing his second stroke with that ball.
