FROM THE ARCHIVES

Research!

Wally Smith.

Wally is certainly one of the club's heroes. It is a name we should all know as he was a great champion and administrator of the club from the 20s to the 70s. Two weeks ago, as I sat in the archive cupboard corner two young men were going from honour board to honour board taking photos. They were at the club for a casual game of golf. They were brothers and when asked proved to be the grandsons of Wally. They were thrilled to be shown the articles about Wally in Ross Lanes' 1988 book and with the wonders of computers we have now been able to send them copies of a variety of articles and photos of Wally. He is on the large panoramic photo of 1927, in teams from the 20s and on the committee in the 50s and 60s. With Wally as winner of the Long Reef Medal twice, a Club Champion in all competition that were available in his time, a frequent course record holder, a President, a Captain and a Life Member they had a variety of honour boards to see!



Top photo-Wally in the swing amongst the sand dunes of a 1936 Long Reef course. Taken from the Golf in Australia Magazine printed on the 19th December 1936. The caption reports that the competition was held on the King's Birthday and that Wally reduced the club record to 66. With him are W.G. Walkeley and E. C. Walters. Below is G. Thomson, (on the right) the previous record holder,

is accompanied by E. Pattison and K. Mc Williams looks on as N. Stirling putts.



Cecil Esdaile

The week before that, our task was to research the Esdaile family on behalf of a family member. Two brothers Arthur and Cecil and Arthur's son Henry joined the club in the early 30s. Cecil was the star golfer and committee man. He was on the committee from 1946 -49. Then in 1949 -50 became Captain, followed in 1950- 53 with four years as President. There were Club Championship wins in 1950 and 1953. He was a Foursomes Champion in 1935 and 1936 partnered by M. Browne and in 1947, 1948, 1949 with R. Ruckley. Team Photos suggests that he was a member of the Grade Team from the 30s onwards. He died at the early age of 46 in 1955. His brother and nephew had left the club in 1943, but did not return to the club after the war.

FROM THE COURSE



We have had very little rain in the past 2 months and the course is really starting to suffer, as is the dam. Things turn around very quickly when the weather is so dry and the hot westerly winds really dry things out. The new work is suffering quite badly as all the new turf does not have an established root system, it may take years for the grass to establish a strong root system to help it cope better with dry weather.

Next week we will start to use mega soaker hoses on all the mounds to help with more efficient watering.

When the weather is so dry it puts a lot of extra pressure on the green staff; it is very difficult to keep 40 hectares of grass alive to cope with all the traffic.

The construction fence was finally removed late last week and the practice fairway is now in use it will take a bit longer before we bring the green into play it still has a way to go but it is growing in well.

Ground Pearl is one of our biggest concerns at the moment. They are causing substantial damage all around the course on fairways, roughs and tees. Ground Pearl are a very small pink bug which have a waxy external coating, they live in the soil and they contaminate the soil to the point where grass cannot grow. There is very little know about these pests and there is no known cure for the damage they make or for their eradication. There is no known pesticide registered for control so everything we do is experimental. We are treating areas with very limited success and it seems the drier the climate gets the more they come to the surface and become prolific to the point where they cover the ground. Birds seem to like them but it has been noted that they are still alive in their droppings which causes even more problems as they spread them easily. They seem to mostly exist in the Wollongong, Sydney, Newcastle areas and they are causing major problems on sporting fields, golf courses and bowling greens. When you see the thin grass cover or bare areas around the course this is the damage caused by Ground Pearl.

Bring on some rain and have a good weekend.

JUNIOR PENNANT

The final round of the Junior Pennant was held last Sunday with Long Reef playing host to Warringah, in a match that would unfortunately have no bearing on the finals race.

Long Reef were bolstered by the return of freshly minted Club Champion Kai Komulainen and A-Reserve champion Mitchell Jones, and the team were intent to finish the season on a positive note.

Harry led the team out in near perfect conditions and got off to a flying start winning the opening two holes. However his opponent soon got into stride and produced a string of pars that belied his 24 handicap. Birdies were required by Harry to even halve a hole and he did very well to stay in the match as long as he did, ultimately going down 3/2.

Jack also clicked into gear early, opening up a healthy 3 hole lead after 5. It was a lead he would not relinquish and he finished his match on the 15th hole in a dominant performance - his best of the season.

Chun-Ta and Mitchell seemed to enjoy getting back together to play in the middle matches as both continued the impressive form they have shown this year.

Mitchell never looked like going behind at any stage winning holes with mistake-free golf and closing it out on the 12th with a 7/6 win.

Chun-Ta had a closer tussle, but seemed always in control, pulling away to record a solid 4/3 win.

So with 3 matches in our keeping we were looking for at least another half point from our senior duo in Kai and Cian. And as has been the case all season in the top two matches, they were high quality affairs.

Kai could have been excused for being a bit flat after his exploits in the club championships the previous week, however he showed no such signs. His match was never more than a hole either way and when Kai made a clutch par on 17 to pull level, he would have liked his chances of closing it out. Unfortunately an uncharacteristic bogey from the middle of the fairway on 18 saw him lose 1 down.

That left Captain Cian to steer the team home. With an impressive display of power hitting, he took

calculated risks when appropriate, driving the green on the 6th when giving his opponent a shot, while resorting to his driving iron at other times when he needed to stay in the hole. It was a well thought out strategy that earned him a 4/3 win and saw Long Reef victorious 4-2.

That result placed Long Reef in a tie for 3rd overall, one point behind the divisional winners Manly. While the team may well feel a little disappointed not to figure in the finals again this year, they can be very proud of their efforts.

To field such a strong team in a handicap event does not make things easy. In fact of the 30 individual matches Long Reef played over the last 5 weeks, we did not receive the benefit of a single shot on handicap in any one of those matches!

This of course augurs well for the future ambitions of the club when these kids start figuring in the Major Pennant and Eric Apperly competitions.

Finally, a big thank you to the Long Reef members who came out to lend their support to the team over the season and to the parents for supporting your child in this great game, through this great club.
