Nola Burke

Sadly, this week we record the death of Nola Burke, member since 1960.

In 2010, Long Reef Members were able to share the celebration and acknowledge the achievements of Nola as she was awarded a Special Certificate by Golf New South Wales following 50 Years of continuous golf playing membership of the club, and 50 years of service to the Club.

Nola joined Long Reef in 1960 and 81 years of age in 2010 she was still playing in the Club's 11-hole competition.

She served on the Women's Committee, taking on the role of Secretary in 1966, 1967 and 1968, and again ten years later in 1977, 1978 and 1979. She was a regular player in the Pennant Teams, and an enthusiastic and reliable volunteer caddy for the Grade Teams over the years.

Nola competed in all Club events over the fifty years, winning the Bronze Premiership in 1978 and 1979 and the Bronze Foursomes in 1979 and 1988. In 2008 she was runner-up in the C-Grade Foursomes.

Nola supported women's golf for her entire playing career and was recognised in 2008, for 45 years of attendance at Duntryleague Week of Golf at Orange.

She was a member of the first group of members of the Bridge Club. As a very valuable member of our club, she supported and encouraged all our members and as a happy participant, she took part in Concerts or helped back stage.

The Burke family are very active members of Long Reef. Her son Peter and daughter-in-law Pam play regularly and her late husband Richie played at Long Reef for 25 years and was a great contributor to the Club.
