The net profit for January 2020 was \$178,137(which included the insurance payout of \$58,470 to compensate for vandalisation to the greens and subsequent loss of income). The year to date net profit is \$406,082 or \$61,071 over budget.

At Alana's Celebration of Life, her family and friends wrote messages of love and support and put them in a pretty little Blue Bottle. They threw the bottle into the ocean at Long Reef NSW, and were amazed when it washed up on Agnes Water Beach QLD almost 12 months later, completely intact. This miracle has given their family great reassurance that Alana is OK and is always with them.

On Sunday 5th April at Griffith Park (next to tennis courts) they are organising the Guinness World Record attempt – "Be A Pineapple" event to raise funds for the Kids Cancer. Alana was their "Pineapple Princess" - she loved all things PINEAPPLE. After her devastating passing, Pineapples have become a symbol of Alana's cherished soul within the Northern Beaches community. They are attempting to set a Guinness World Record for "The Largest Human Image of a Fruit' by creating the world's largest human Pineapple!! A sausage sizzle will follow directly afterwards.

RULES WITH GEORGE



ANSWER: b. is correct. Rule 13.1 c applies. Sand and loose soil are not loose impediments. (Definitions: Loose Impediments). Rule 13.1 c allows Improvements on the Putting Green.

During a round and while play is stopped under **Rule 5.7 a**, a player may take these two actions on the putting green, no matter whether the ball is <u>on or off</u> the putting green.

(1) Sand and loose soil on the putting green (**but** not anywhere else on the course) may be removed without penalty.

(2) A player may repair damage on the putting green without penalty
