Competition changes -

With the postponement of the course closure to March 30th and 31st, we have adjusted the timing of some upcoming events. To ensure it is played on the best course conditions, the April Medal will be brought forward to Saturday March 28th (from April 4th). A 4 ball Ambrose event will now take place on Wednesday 1st April and the 5 club competition (originally scheduled for Saturday 21st) will move to Saturday 4th April.

COVID-19 update -

In case you didn't receive/read yesterday's Email, below is a summary of the "social distancing" changes that we have introduced to protect the wellbeing of our Members and staff.

Bring your own sunscreen to apply on the course as the dispensers on the 1st and 9th tees have been removed.

Leave the flag in at all times

Do not swap cards - collect and mark your own card. At the end of your round, secure verbal agreement from your playing partner and sign your card as both the player and marker.

Cards should not be entered into the Micropower terminals but must be left in the adjacent trays. It is recommended that only one person rides in a cart. The cart may carry two bags and if you choose that more than one person will drive the cart, you should be prepared to wipe the steering wheel and seat at every change of driver.

Rakes will be removed from bunkers so please use your foot or back of your club to smooth the bunker after playing your shot. When removing your ball from the hole, please ensure that you do so with a glove on.

There will be no "Nearest the Pin" or "Circle" competitions and the money usually set aside for these prizes will be allocated to additional "ball prizes".

If using the screen to book/check a tee time and as a courtesy to the next Member, please use the wipes next to the terminals to clean the screen after use.

The above list obviously does not cover all potential touch-points, so we would ask Members to be vigilant and diligent at all times on the course and prioritise your own and your fellow members' health and safety.

RULES WITH GEORGE



ANSWER: d. is correct. Rule 9.4 applies. In having a practice swing, Sony has not played a stroke at the ball. His practice swing has caused his ball to move so he gets one penalty stroke

(Rule 9.4 b), and under Rule 9.4 a his ball must be replaced.

If a player accidentally moves his ball before it is found, there would not have been a penalty, but this is not the case in this situation.

If Sony had not replaced his moved ball, he would have incurred the General Penalty (2 strokes) for playing from the Wrong Place in Breach of **Rule 9.4.**

When a player accidentally moves a ball when playing from the Teeing Area there is no penalty because the ball is not in play until a stroke is made....**Rule 6.2 b**(5).

FROM THE BOARD COVID 19 UPDATE

During the course of this pandemic the Board and staff will be working diligently to maximise the safety of the course and Clubhouse for Members, staff, guests and suppliers. This will be a prolonged and challenging period.

We remind all Members to remain diligent and to take practical precautions to look after your health and the health of others. We have a shared responsibility for health and safety by following very simple steps- keep a social distance of at least 1.5 metres from others and wash your hands with warm soapy water regularly. Please observe the preventative measures by looking out for potential symptoms and following the guidance from the Department of Health.

Effective immediately the following guidelines and policies will take effect at the Club until further notice:

- The Club will not be accepting cash in the Club or Pro shop to pay for transactions. Members are able to settle their transactions by debit or credit card via tap and go, or by using their house account.
- There will no longer be swiping of the Member card and it will be sufficient to show the card to staff.
- Introduction of single use menus.
- Every second poker machine has been switched off.
- Staff where possible are practicing social distancing.
- There are also a number of preventative measures being introduced for the course which will be sent as a separate email by our Captain Doug.

We are mindful that this is situation is fluid and events change daily. Our priority is always the health and safety of our Members, staff, guests and the wider community. We will continue to keep you regularly updated as new decisions are made and actions implemented.

Please note the following conditions have now also been introduced.

TAB operations

To help reduce contact, the TAB ticket terminal is now closed. The self-betting terminal will remain open and you can collect any winning from the main terminal behind the bar. We ask that Members wipe down the self-betting terminal screen with the provided sanitary wipes after every use.

Friday Raffle

Due to a supplier shortage Friday Night Raffle will be cancelled effective from today. We will update you when suppliers can continue to provide the trays to recommence the meat and seafood raffle.

Members Draw

Our Members Draw will still go ahead at 6pm with increased prizes. 3 x \$40 vouchers for the first 3 names called followed by 6 golf ball prizes.

Bubblers on Course

As of today all bubblers on the course will cease to be in use. Please ensure that you bring enough water for you to remain hydrated while you play golf.

Ball washers

As of today all ball washers on the course will be unable to be used.

Sand Buckets

As of today Members will be asked to bring their own sand bucket. From 5.30pm today sanitised buckets will be available for Members from the proshop to pick up and use until further notice.

Extension for the purging of house, voucher and ball accounts.

Due to numerous members having to self-isolate and not able to return from abroad the Board has extended the date that house, voucher and ball accounts will be purged until **April 30**.
